Competition Rules

1. Competition overview

1.1 Purpose

The Normandy International Baroque Music Competition is organized by Le Poème Harmonique. Its purpose is to provide young performers of baroque music with an opportunity of gaining recognition from the public as well as prominent representatives of the international music scene, as a start to an international career. The Competition calls upon a jury of distinguished artists, professors and concert promoters, and creates partnerships in order to provide its laureates with the best possible opportunities.

Through this initiative, Le Poème Harmonique continues its commitment to the baroque repertoire by inviting young musicians to perform their renditions of famous or lesser-known works.. The Competition thus aims at promoting baroque music beyond the margins of competitive challenge..

Finally, the Competition is an excellent opportunity for bringing together the Norman public and baroque music. The trials, held over a period of several days, are to enable the audience to discover or enrich their knowledge of the presented repertoire through the diversity of the program. This event thus has the dual vocation of educating and entertaining while at the same time placing the focus on musical excellence and originality.

1.2 Venue

All stages of the competition will take place at the Chapelle Corneille, in Rouen.

3. Application procedures

3.1 Eligibility

The competition is open to candidates born from January 1, 1989.

3.2 Application period

Applications must be filed between April 29 and June 27, 2019.

3.3 Procedures

Applicants must go to Le Poème Harmonique's official website (http://www.lepoemeharmonique.fr/), click Competition > Competition rules and application, and create an account. They shall then have to pay a 50 euros fee, to upload the following files:

- An image file of a recent coloured photograph, for use in the program and other promotional materials (the copyright must be mentioned in the file's name)
- A PDF or image file of an official document that contains the applicant's name, nationality and date of birth (a passport is recommended)

- A curriculum vitae in pdf format
- A PDF file of a biography
- A youtube, dailymotion or similar link to a video performance, following the notes in paragraph 4 (Preliminary selection) below.

Applicants may access their account as many times as they wish to add, delete or change materials until the application is finished. On July 1st, 2018, the application process will be closed and no more changes will be possible.

4. Preliminary selections

4.1 Selection process

The preliminary selection will be made on the basis of the video recordings presented throughout the candidate area.

4.2 Program

Applicants must present a performance of approximately 10 minutes of a free program.

The video may be a live concert performance and must not necessarily be newly recorded for the Competition. However, material recorded in good technical and acoustic conditions is recommended.

4.3 Notification of results

The results will be available online by **July 12, 2018.** Once shortlisted, the candidate must specify the works he or she wishes to perform in the three rounds of the competition by **Monday, July 22nd** at the very latest.

5. Participation in the Competition.

5.1 Application fee

Applicants must pay an application fee of €50 as part of the online application process.

No further fees will be required.

5.2 Contestant registration

Contestants must present themselves at the Chapelle Corneille on September 11 to draw their appearance number. Contestants who cannot arrive on September 11 may issue a proxy for the drawing to the competition manager.

5.3 Homestay accommodation

In order to minimize the cost of participation for contestants, Le Poème Harmonique offers homestay accommodation in Rouen. Contestants who wish to benefit from such accommodation must mention it in the application process. Applications for homestay accommodation will be managed in order of reception.

5.4 Practice rooms and rehearsals

Practice rooms will be made available freely to contestants. Practice schedules will be managed according to availability for the day in question.

On September 11, contestants will be able to try the acoustics of the Chapelle Corneille during assigned time slots.

Finalists will rehearse with the accompanying ensemble on the morning of **15 September**.

5.5 Order of appearance

The order of appearance will be determined the evening of the host day and may only be modified according to the logistical necessity, by decision of the Competition Manager.

6. Program

We hereby specify that the chosen works may not be common to several stages of the competition

Pitches:

For the first and second stage of the competition, 3 pitches are allowed (392 Hz, 415 Hz and 440 Hz).

For the final stage, the 415 Hz pitch is imposed.

Transpositions are not allowed.

Preselection - 10 minutes at the latest:

Two works, including at least a 17th or 18th century opera aria in Italian or French

1st stage - 12 minutes maximum:

- 1) A French opera aria from the 17th or 18th century
- 2) An Italian or English opera aria from the 17th or 18th century

One of the works must be from the 17th century, the other from the 18th century. One of the works must include a recitative.

2nd stage: Semi-Final - 12 minutes at the latest:

- 1) A sacred work of the 17th century
- 2) An 18th century work of your choice (opera or not)

Final stage: between 12 and 15 minutes

Choose two or three pieces of music, including at least one in each category, depending on your type of voice. Countertenors will have to choose two or three works from amongst Italian works.

- Take recordings, photos or video which will be later used to produce printed materials, CDs, DVDs etc. for promotion and sales.

8.3 Protection of personal data

Personal data of applicants and contestants collected for the Competition will be managed by Le Poème Harmonique according to French law and will be used only for the operation of the Competition.

8.4 Legal guidelines

According to French taxation law, awards money is not subject to tax..

Any disputes that arise in connection with these Competition rules will be resolved according to the original French text of the Competition rules and French law.
